

Important Update to Travel Requirements

The safety and health of our guests and community are of the utmost importance to us. As part of the Hawaii Safe Travels Program, we strongly advise our visitors to visit <https://www.hawaiicovid19.com/travel> prior to your flight and upcoming stay to get the most updated information.

Domestic Travelers:

Beginning March 26, 2022, Gov. D. Ige is ending the travel quarantine and Safe Travels Hawaii program for domestic travelers. Passengers arriving from domestic points will not have to show proof of a COVID-19 vaccination or a pre-travel negative test result.

International Travelers:

Travelers arriving in Hawaii directly from international airports must comply with U.S. federal requirements; consult your airline for more information.

Non-U.S. citizens traveling directly to Hawaii from an international destination must present BOTH a vaccination record AND a negative COVID-19 test result (NAAT or antigen) within one day of boarding a flight to the U.S.

U.S. Citizens flying directly to Hawaii from an international destination have two options:

- Travelers must provide proof of an up-to-date vaccination document and present a test (NAAT or antigen) ** taken within one day of boarding their flight to U.S. OR
- Travelers not up to date with their vaccination must provide proof or a negative COVID-19 test (NAAT or antigen) result within one (1) day of boarding flight to U.S.

** Note: Tests do NOT have to be done with Trusted Travel Partners under the new international federal law requirements, but they MUST be done with a Trusted Travel Partner for unvaccinated domestic travel.

The airlines will screen passengers prior to their departure to the U.S. If foreign passengers fail to meet BOTH requirements and if U.S. citizens fail to meet ONE of the two requirements, they will not be allowed to board the flight.
